Prices were in everyones range from very cheap to the downright high!

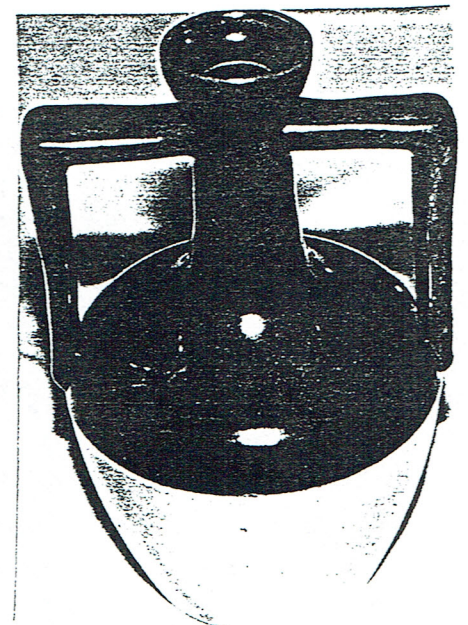
Too photo, a pink #143 8 cup teapot was priced at \$135.

tagged #45.

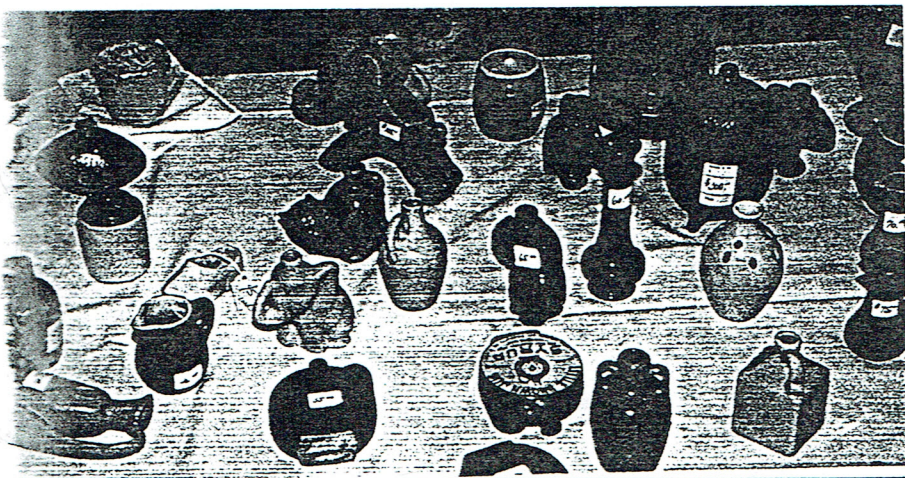


Third photo, blue

marked #175.

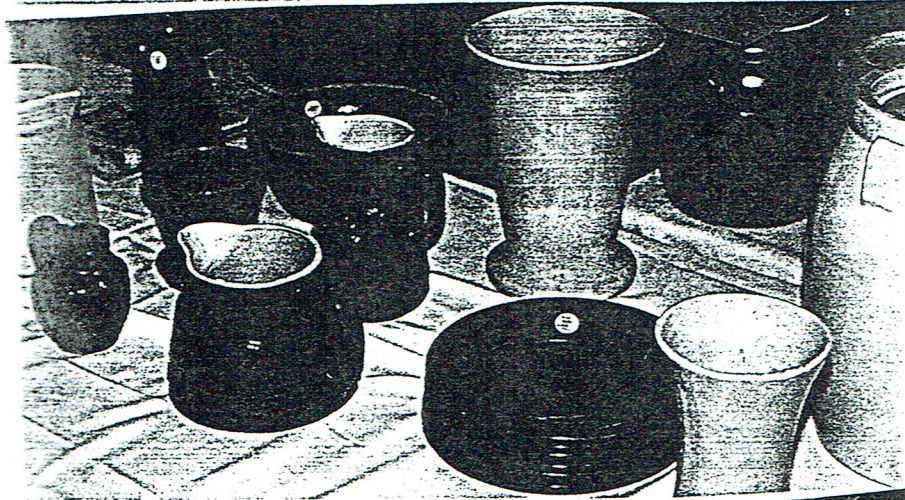


Fourth photo, brown

tagged #125.

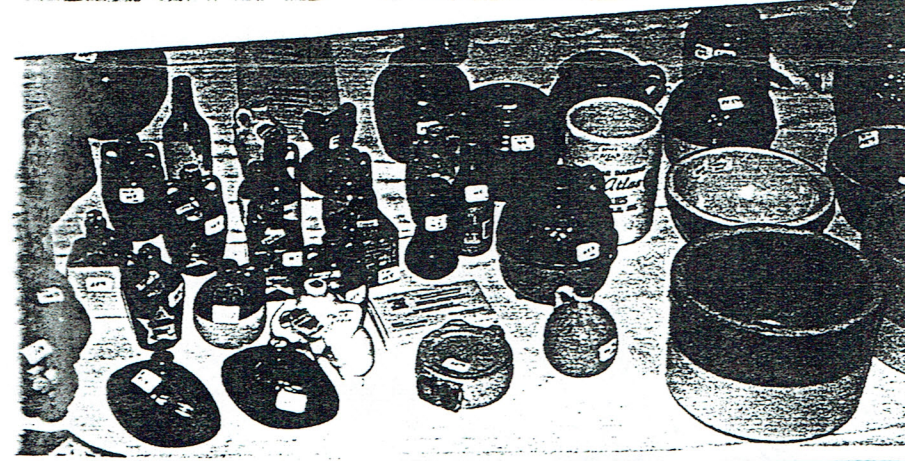




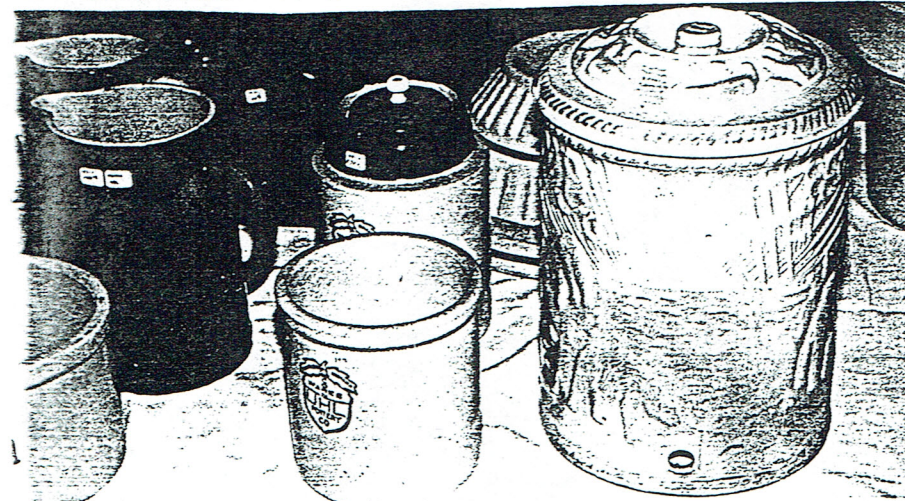
The 3 legged green jar with an acorn like lid in brown was priced #300.



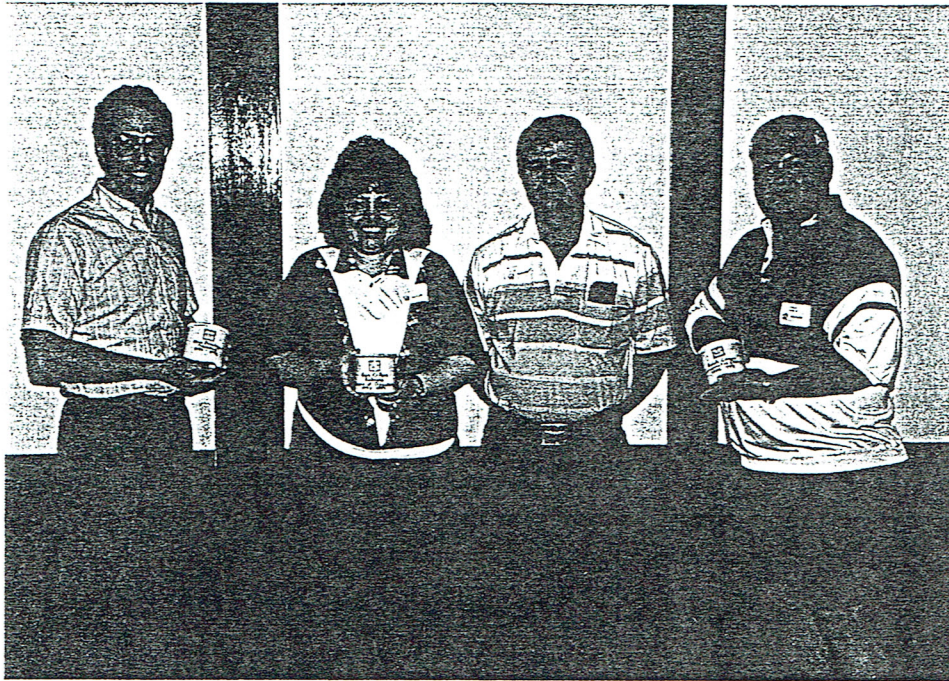
The six green plates as a set were marked #500.



A white baseball jug had a sticker of #95.



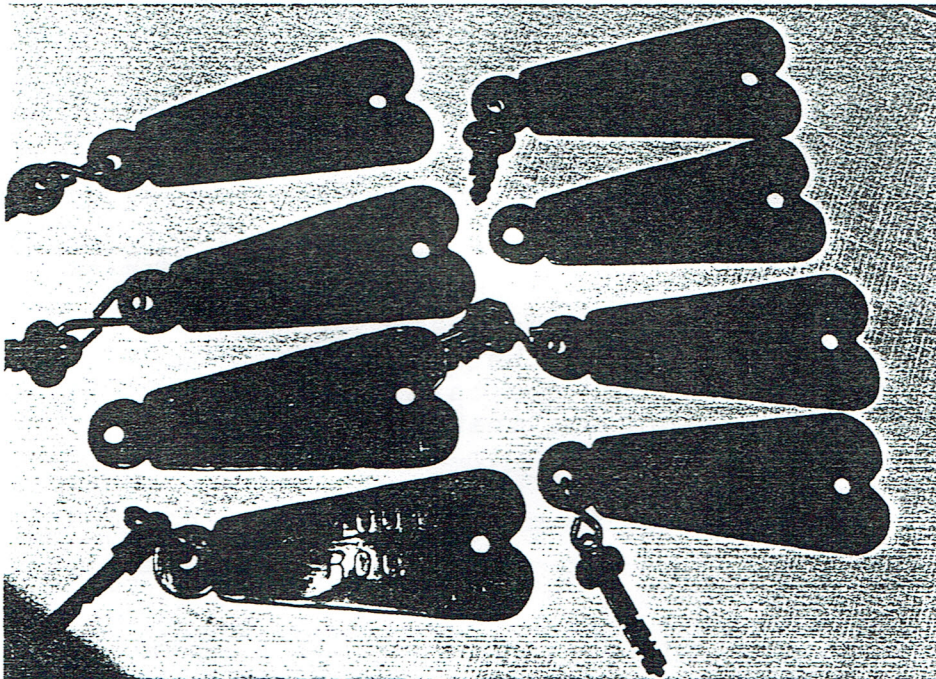
While a blue and white polar bear water cooler with lid was priced at \$695.

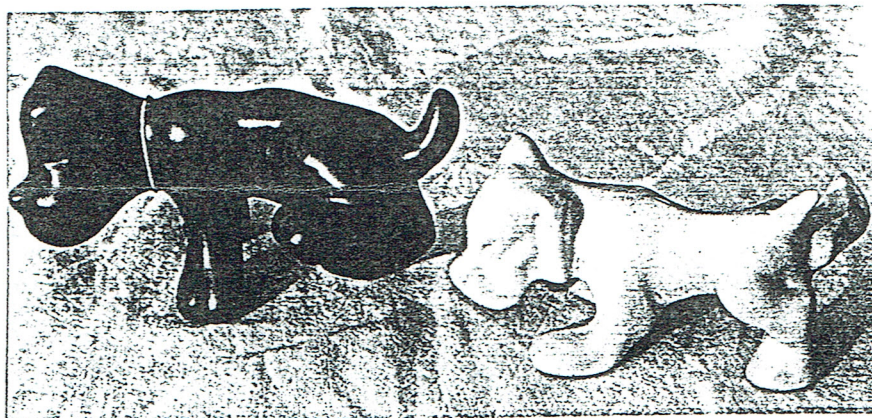
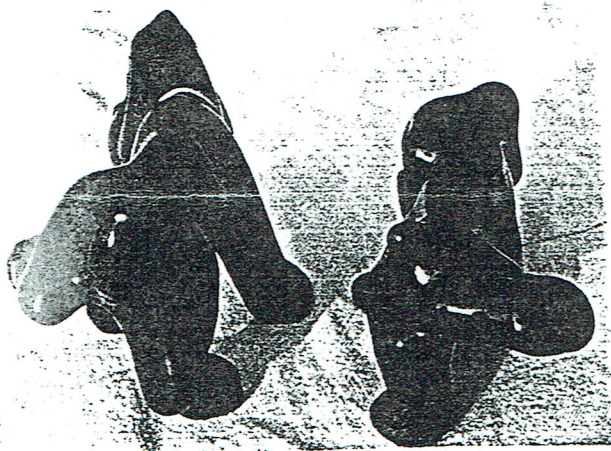

DO YOU KNOW?



Do you know the difference between the Uhl dog and the non-Uhl dog? In the above pictures the dog on the left is NOT UHL and the dog on the right IS UHL. One major difference is the right rear leg must be hiked to be the real thing. Another is the Uhl dog is smaller in size, and the tail is straight and comes to a point, unlike the non-uhl dog that has a thick and bent tail. The head is all together different in size and shape. The Uhl dog has the normal creme color to the clay on the bottom of the feet and the non-Uhl has a very white color to the clay on the bottom of the feet.

Also Uhl never made a dog squatting, but the non-Uhl dog can be found in the squatting position.

REMEMBER: RIGHT IS RIGHT AND LEFT IS WRONG!
