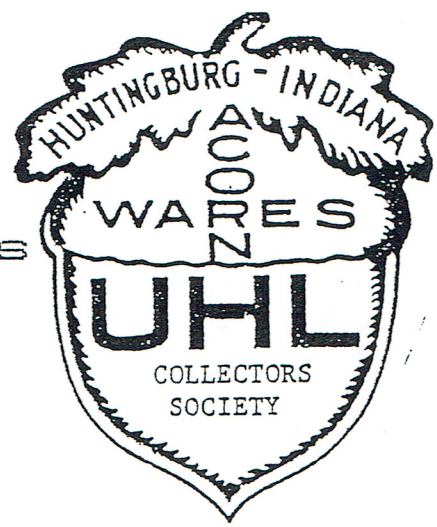

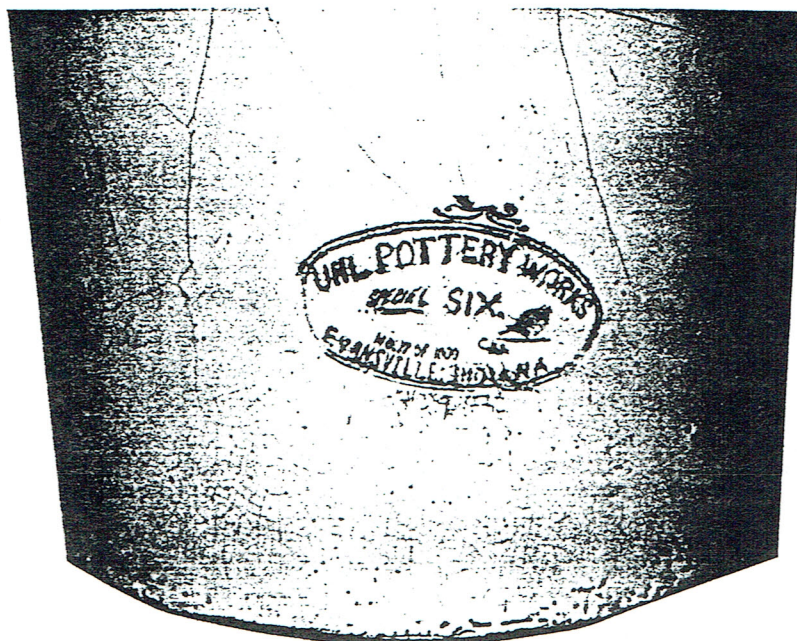

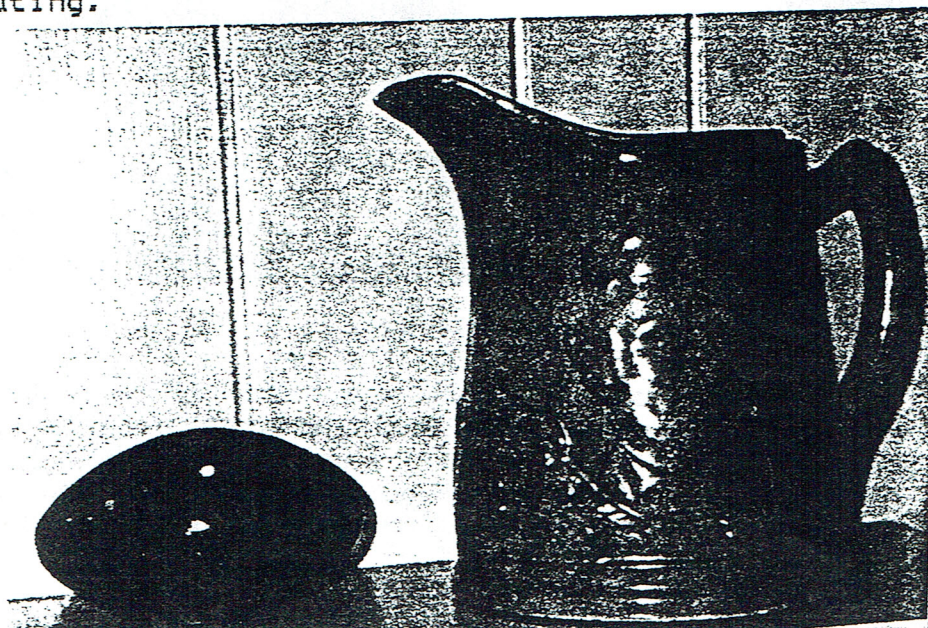
As for our question and answer section, nothing came in the mail so we can't go any further as of this time.

We found 5 Uhl miniatures in a whiskey bottle collection in one antique shop. The best news of all is we had to pay \$10 each for the miniatures.

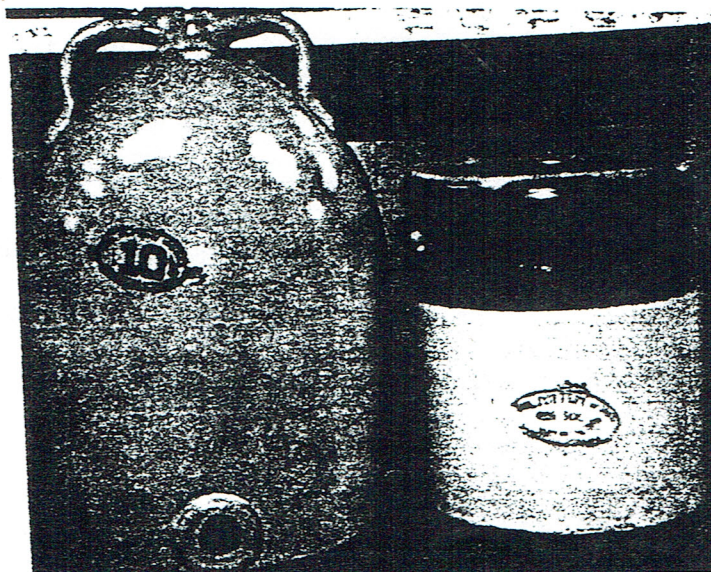
We could hardly wait to get out of the shop so we could start shouting.



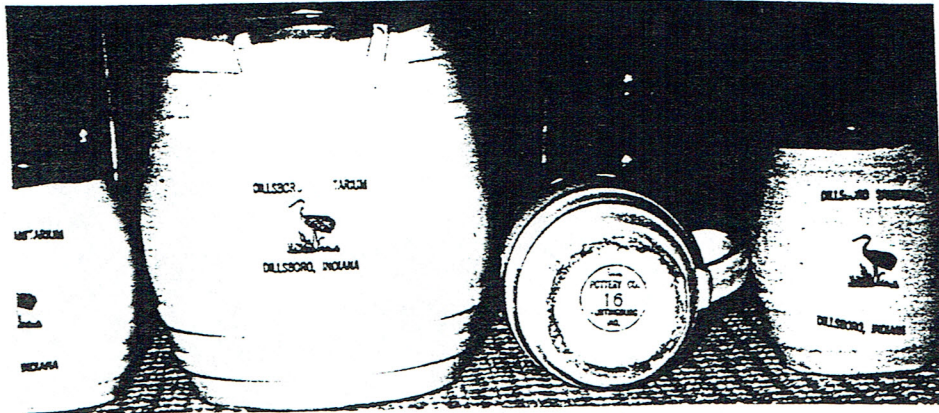

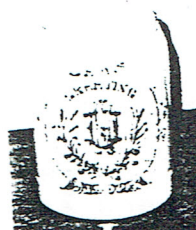


For all of you collecting Evansville Uhl you may want to stop in at a small shop at 414 S Barker Ave in Evansville. They have a wide variety of jars and jugs. Like the 10 gal double handled jug above. You may even see that special six!!!!



We have had some club members say that the Dillsboro Sanitarium pieces were not made by Uhl. But the above picture shows this nice blue and white set with a mug on its side, showing an Uhl stamp on the bottom. Bill and Kitty Swanson are the proud owners of this nice set. Kitty purchased the pitcher recently at an antique show.

The two mugs above were found recently by Jerry and Mary Hanebutt of Huntingburg. The first is a flagon mug with a decal of the French Lick Springs Hotel-French Lick Springs In. It also has gold trim around the top.

The second mug is also a flagon mug with the number 12 on the bottom. It's decal reads, Uhl's Greeting 1902 and has wheat grain with oak leaves and acorns all throughout the wreath in the center of the decal.

The Story of My Uhl Tea Set

Back in the late 1940's, when I was a teenager, I received an allowance of \$1.00 per week. Every Saturday afternoon after receiving this allowance, I would visit a nearby second-hand store. Yes, even then I liked old things! One Saturday afternoon I spied this beautiful tea set high up on a shelf. The owner, who by this time was used to seeing me come in, discouraged me from looking at it, because, she said, "It was too expensive".

The price of the tea set was \$3.00. I finally convinced her to sell it to me on the lay-away plan. So, every Saturday for three weeks I visited the store and handed over my whole allowance.

My mother was quite surprised when I brought the tea set home, because always before my purchases had been just little trinkety things. The tea set was given a place of permanent display on a corner cabinet in our dining room. It stayed there during my years in school, but went with me when I moved into my first apartment.

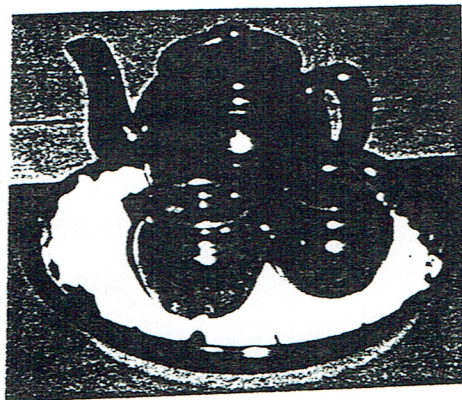
On my wedding day, the tea set was prominently displayed on the table at the reception along with the wedding cake and punch bowl. It went with us when my husband and I moved into our first home. I bought a hutch-cabinet and the tea set found a home there. It is still there today after many years and several moves.

Through the years I had wondered about the Uhl Pottery Co., and Huntingburg, Indiana. Twice I wrote to the Chamber of Commerce in Huntingburg, requesting information about Uhl Pottery, but never received an answer. The only information my research brought me, was that the Uhl Pottery Co., was no longer in business. Then about eight years ago, in the Antique section of our Sunday newspaper, I found the address of the Uhl Collectors Society! The rest as they say, is history.

I would never sell my Uhl tea set, it has been too much a part of my life, but, I may give it away. Having no children of my own to give it to, I plan to give it to a neice, who like her Aunt, "Just loves old things".
