In Search of . . . Uhl Animals

Uhl Collectors have a wonderful opportunity to obtain their favorite pottery in various animal shapes.

This issue will be the first half of a two part report about some of the animals produced by Uhl Pottery.

Please understand that there are probably more animal shapes out there which are not mentioned in this article and hopefully our membership can enlighten us by sharing information about other various pieces they might have.

In an attempt to acquaint collectors with some Uhl animals, we will write about the frogs, rabbits, dogs, donkeys and pigs.

Any additional information you can share with our readers will be greatly appreciated. Just drop us a line and we will publish follow up information.

Uhl animal figures were used as planters, banks, jugs and lamp bases. Please note all sizes are approximate because shrinkage can vary.


Frogs in the sitting position were made in fours sizes. The largest size measured about 13 inches long by 7 1/2 inches tall. Next size below the big frog measure about 9 inches long x 4 3/4 inches tall. The third size down frog figure is about 6 inches long by 3 1/2 inches tall. Smallest of the sizes measures about 3 inches long x 2 1/4 inches tall.

Colors of the frogs tend to be in mixed natural colors of green and brown. Some of the more unusual colors have bright green solid colors.

Most of the larger examples will have the mouth open. While smaller examples tend to have a closed mouth. Bases are usually unglazed with a large hollow opening.

Rabbits produced by Uhl Pottery included the flat sided rabbit and the rabbit with a basket.

Flat sided rabbits were made as planters and as figurals with no planter opening. They resemble the design McCoy pottery used

They resemble the design McCoy pottery used for their popular line of "Stretch style" animals. Always a favorite among collectors the flat sided rabbit is known in one size only. Common Uhl production colors of blue, white, black, pumpkin and rose were used most of the time.

A rabbit with basket planter was also made at the factory. This rabbit is standing on his hind feet with a tall tapered basket attached to the back. Each ear of the rabbit drapes down on sides of basket. The bottom of this planter is unglazed.

Dogs are a large category of the Uhl animal family.

Scottie dogs in the sitting position were made as planters, figurals and lamp bases. The head of Scotties will be turned at 90 degrees to the body. Used as planters or figurals (no planter opening) this dog will have an unglazed solid bottom. Lamp bases have a hollow bottom glazed inside. Average size of the Scottie dog is 9 inches long by 6 1/2 inches tall. They have been found in black, blue, white colors so far.

Boston Terriers in the sitting position were also made at Uhl

pottery. Again the face is at a 90 degree angle to the body. For those collectors familiar to the famous "Mack Truck" dog mascot this dog has a similar face. The Boston Terrier measures about 4 inches long by 4 inches tall.

NOTE: Both the Scottie and the Boston Terrier will have an "open" tail. (Meaning you can place your finger between the tail and body.)

Very popular among Uhl collectors are the "Raised Leg" dogs. These hound dog figurals in their own comical manner were available as singles, on ashtrays or mini jugs. Also an honorable mention should be given to the fire hydrant which was sold single or as a combination with the hound "taking aim" at it.

Collectors should make note that the dog will have his right rear leg in the air. As easy way to remember this is "right is right - left is wrong".

The dog with hydrant ashtray is 5 inches in diameter and 4 inches tall. It usually has the factory mold number 199 on the underside.

Ashtrays with the raised leg dog only were produced at the factory. This ashtray and dog combination measure 4 1/2 inches diameter and 3 1/4 inches tall. This usually carried the mold number 173 on the underside.

Small standing dog figurals were

made from molds of a small squeak toy dog. This dog is standing with front legs connected and back legs connected. Measurements for the cute dog is 2 inches long by 2 inches tall. Colors found so far are black or white.

Politicians could even have their favorite symbols cast by Uhl Pottery.

Donkeys in the sitting position were made as planters and lamp bases. The planter style donkey has a solid base and the lamp base in this design will have hollow base. Some of the mouths were "cut out" (open mouth) or solid (Closed mouth). Average size measurements are 5 1/4 inches long by 6 1/4 tall.

Donkey ashtrays were made with ashtrays similar to the dog ashtray models. This donkey is a small version compared to the planter and is in a standing position.

Pigs made by Uhl were used as banks, planters and ashtrays.

Pointed ear pigs were used as banks and came in three sizes. Smallest of these banks measured by 6 inches long by 4 inches tall. Medium size pointed ear pig banks are about 7 inches long by 5 inches tall. Largest of the banks in this designs about 9 1/2 inches long by 6 1/2 inches tall. Colors found so far included white, blue, black, yellow and rose.

Pointed ear pig planters were made in the size similar to the

smallest pig bank dimensions. It has a large opening at top.

Kansas city pigs came in two sizes. Named because of a mold found with Kansas City pig noted on it. Collectors also refer to it as a "round eared" pig. The length of the largest size "round eared" pig is about 9 1/2 inches long also the smaller round ear pig is about the same as the pointed ear pig length of 6 inches long.


"Round ear" pig planters were also made by Uhl usually in the small bank size.

"Hitler" pig banks made during the war are round ear pigs with a painted picture of Adolph in the pigs rear end. Additional artwork was painted on this pig bank also.

Pig ashtrays were produced with a length of about 3 1/4 inches long x 2 inches tall. Designed similar to pig planter style opening look for an indentation on rim for resting cigarette.


