The Scoop on Uhl Garden Pottery

Uhl Collectors can learn to spot their favorite pottery in yards while driving around town.

This two part article will attempt to acquaint collectors with a portion of Uhl garden pottery. Please realize this is not the entire extent of Uhl's production.

Items to be discussed in this part of the presentation will include hanging baskets, bird baths, Athenian pots, Italian oil jars, strawberry jars, and Egyptian pots.

Color information was taken from Uhl catalog descriptions. As time progressed Uhl pottery did add more colors to their products so don't be surprised to find these items in more colors than what is discussed.

Uhl hanging baskets came in two different styles and 4 sizes. A wire hanger was used to hang the pots.

The 8 inch size hanging pot was made as though it had a narrow strip woven basket design, while the 3 larger sizes were made like a bark basket with wider bands horizontal around the pot.

These horizontal ribbed baskets came in 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch and 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch diameters. Some of the earlier catalogs said they were 9 inch, 10 inch and 12 inch sizes. Colors included terra cotta, red burned and green tint.

Several models of bird baths were made by Uhl. The rustic bird bath had a lily leaf pattern on the pedestal with matching patterns on the outer rim of the bowl. Overall height was 26 inches tall. The bowl was 21 inches in diameter with a 2 gallon capacity. Colors include brushed green and terra cotta for the rustic model.

Plain yet functional was the model X-10 bird bath which came in a terra cotta color. It had a plain shallow sided bowl 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter with a 2

gallon capacity. Overall height of the X-10 was 26 inches tall with an undecorated pedestal.

Roman bird baths came in four combinations. The C-5 model has an overall height of 18 inches tall while the bowl measures 18 inches in diameter. Next came a C-9 model which was taller at 24 inches overall height and had a bowl diameter of 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

Taller Roman bird bath models included the C-10 model with a height of 26 inches overall and a bowl with a 23 inches diameter. The bowl size was the same for the large C-20 model however it was 38 inches tall.

Some Roman bird baths have narrow spaced flutes around the pedestal while the bowl has a raised floral pattern around outside rim. Colors available for these bird baths were terra cotta, old ivory and green.

Uhl produced a "flower urns" which resembled a plain shouldered bowl on a plain pedestal. The overall height of it was 30 inches tall with a 16 inches wide bowl, which held 2 gallons. "Flower urn" were offered in a terra cotta color.

Athenian #515 pots were offered in colors such as terra cotta, brushed green and burned red. An oriental influence was used on this model with raised round and rectangular shapes alternating around the side. Measurements are 16 inches wide by 13 inches tall for this pot. Collectors might find this sitting on a #515 Athenian pedestal. The height of the pedestal measured 18 inches tall.

Italian oil jars came in several sizes. The model #500 oil jar was 24 inches tall by 18 inches in diameter. Other models with dimensions were #501 at 30 inches tall and 18 inch diameter, #508 at 24 inches tall and 16 inches diameter, #510 at 19 inches

tall and $12 \frac{1}{2}$ inches diameter, and #512 at 15 inches tall and 9 inches diameter. Later models of the #510 and #512 Italian oil jars were offered in blue, green or yellow.

Strawberry jars came in several models with terra cotta or russet finishes. Later production catalogs offer blue, green and yellow. Strawberry jars with dimensions are #502 at 30 inches tall and 22 inches diameter, #503 at 6 inches tall, #504 at 8 inches tall, #509 at 24 inches tall and 18 inches diameter, #511 at 19 inches tall and 16 inches diameter and #513 at 15 inches tall with an 11 inch diameter.

Largest of the strawberry jars was the model #501 Japanese jar with 15 pockets. Overall height of this was 30 inches and its shape resemble a #501 Italian oil jar with pockets.

Egyptian standard pots were popular among gardeners. Originally offered in terra cotta it has also been found in other glazes. Ten different sizes were offered. Pot diameters are 4 inch, 5 inch, 6 inch, 7 inch, 8 inch, 9 inch, 10 inch, 12 inch, 14 inch and a large 16 inch container. Designed with a winged pyramid symbol around top shoulder of pot and wide ribs around the lower 2/3 of it makes identification easy.

Similar Egyptian Azalea pots were offered in terra cotta. This model came in the same diameters as the standard. Azalea pots are a shorter squat version of the standard pot with the same outside designs.

Designers are now using this wonderful pottery inside homes for a pleasant added detail for a room.

Some garden pottery was marked with a model number. However like all Uhl it is not unusual for pieces to be found that have no marks.

This article is intended to make the reader aware of some of the Uhl Pottery production. Please realize that not all the garden pottery designs are included in this presentation.

SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE AT SHELTON AUCTION

Uhl Collectors were offered a unique opportunity to attend an auction of 330 pieces of their favorite pottery.

Roger and Roberta Shelton sold part of their 17 year collection September 20, 1997, at the Jasper, Indiana fairgrounds. Brahm & Brahm Auctioneers handled the selling. (The following information is for undamaged items.)

Jane Uhl fans paid \$305 for a red sprinkler, \$30 for a marked bowl and \$35 for a marked saucer

Marked hand turned items brought as high as \$250 for a marked tall green hand turned 3 handled vase. The lowest price marked piece sold for \$50. It was a green hand turned plate.

Unmarked hand turned pieces went as high as \$240 for a yellow mini hand turned

pitcher with "Camp Forrest" advertising. A bid of \$20 bought the lowest priced unmarked hand turned piece, which was a blue hand, turned saucer.

Several mini jugs were available such as prunellas, double handled, demijohn, square, canteen, Egyptian and Grecian selling in the range of \$20 to \$40.

Advertising jugs were bid off at \$450 for a brown/white mini shoulder jug w/"Lafayette Malt Store", \$275 for brown/ white prunella Xmas jug w/ "greetings from Uhl", and \$395 for a brown/white mini globe w/"compliments from Uhl Pottery Co. Huntingburg, Ind."

A Black #14 mini ring jug found a new home for \$145 and a tan botay canteen jug marked "Malden Air Field" changed owners for \$400


If you wanted a Meiers white softball jug it would sell for \$260 at this auction

Uhl Potterv animals brought \$85 for a rose flat rabbit planter, \$205 for a black wrinkle skin elephant planter, \$180 for a yellow rabbit basket planter and \$65 for a white lamb planter.

Popular among all collectors were the black Scotty dog figure which sold for \$525 and the brown hollow cat doorstop signed V.Volz which reached \$625

Thieves jars in blue, marked with number were purchased for \$400 in the #135 size, \$500 in the #136 size and \$450 in the #137 size.






#500 Oil Jar


