MORE UHL JUGS AT A GLANCE

Well fellow "Uhlies" it's time for another convention in just a few short weeks.

This is a follow up from our last issue (May 1999) about Uhl Jugs. Hopefully there will be some interesting examples of these jugs at our 1999 convention. Please keep in mind that this is not all the jugs produced by Uhl! Also this does not include miniatures.

Shoulder jugs are the most common style of stoneware jug produced by Uhl Pottery. They were solid brown, solid white, or even a blue top and white bottom such as the Dillsboro jugs. Sizes made included small the ¼ gallon and the ½ gallon sizes and the full gallon sizes from 1 to 5 gallons.

Another interesting Uhl production piece was the squat bailed jug. It usually had a brown upper portion and white bottom. The buyer had a choice of two sizes the ½ gallon or the 1-gallon model. Squat bailed jugs had a wire bail with wood handle attached to mounts on the top of the jug and no finger loop at the jug spout. The shoulder was rounded.

Sorghum jugs were one

of the largest size production jugs made by Uhl. They were available with either a single or double handle. Brown with white was the common color combination. Sorghum jugs can be found with or without the faucet hole at the base. Designed to handle larger volumes these round-shouldered jugs were made in eight and ten gallon sizes.

Druggist jugs offered by Uhl came in only one size being one gallon. The shoulder on the druggist jug is different. This jug tends to have more of a cone shaped top which blends evenly to the body of the jug (no protruding edge). Also the druggist jug handle does not attach to the spout, rather it is mounted more toward the shoulder. Brown with white was the offered color.

Harvest jugs had an unusual design with two openings at the top. One side had a common size pouring spout at the outer edge while on opposite side was a small cone shaped opening for an air vent. They came in a one-gallon size only and brown with white as the common color.

Uhl harvest jugs were available with a wire bail handle (similar to the squat bailed jug) or a stoneware handle which was a

large strap design from one side of shoulder across to opposite side. They were promoted as "the perfect drinking jug" and had a rounded shoulder.

Acorn jugs were a smaller size production piece. As their name implies, they were made to resemble an acorn. The upper half was usually a brown color and the lower half could be natural or white. A textured upper half of this jug resembles an acorn cap. The single handle attaches to the spout and upper half. Acorn jugs have a slight pointed bottom and three post style feet. Capacity of this novelty jug was 10 ounces.

The very early production Evansville jugs were similar to the bee hive design with a short spout.

Uhl also produced "special order" jugs such as a five-gallon model that actually held 4 gallons. Bootleggers loved this one! Look around and compare sizes of the same mark and you might find one of them!

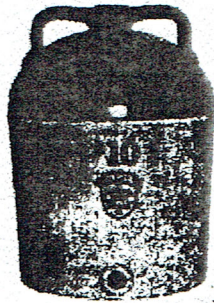
