UHL POTTERY IDENTIFICATION BOOK ON ITS WAY!!

Early this month I had the pleasure of spending time with Anna Mary Feldmeyer and her lovely Grand-daughter Kara Holtzman who just happen to be providing us with a new Uhl Pottery Identification and Value Guide. How wonderful this will be. If you ask me, it is long overdue and you couldn't 'have a better author. Anna Mary and her husband Don are known as one of the major Uhl collectors. Their knowledge & opinion is always welcome and appreciated by all.

Anna Mary has always had Uhl Pottery as part of her life. Both her mother and father worked for the pottery. Her father drove a truck that hauled the pottery to retailers all around. Anna Mary and Don started collecting seriously in the early 70's when Christmas jugs and blue and white mini's sold for \$0.25 in yard sales. Don recalls passing up Christmas jugs for they were not something he was particularly needing for his collection at that time. Though the Feldmeyers do most of their auctioning in Southern Indiana, most of their collection was obtained in the local community in which they live. Word of mouth had it that they were collecting so neighbors and friends would contact them for first opportunities. Sometimes it was a simple miniature or if they were lucky a hand turned piece, but every now and then a special, one of a kind piece made on an employees lunch hour or for an employees family or friend was being offered. These pieces are one of a kind and the stories that come with them make them even more valuable.

Kara can recall the days of boredom at Grandma & Grandpa Feldmeyers. Heck who would want to go there when you can't play hide – n – seek or chase for the fear of breaking one of the "pretties" sitting around their home? Well with that came the respect and appreciation that her Grandparents taught her for these pottery pieces were not just old, they were part of their communities history. Kara is currently a full time student with a full scholarship at Ball State with an interest in writing. She has heard Anna Mary mention many times since her retirement that she would like to put out a book on Uhl Pottery. Attending the convention for the first time in 1999 she knew there was indeed a need for this reference guide. So in December of 1999 Kara and her grandmother started researching a publisher, taking many photos and writing descriptions.

Together with 'Collector Books' they have filled an 8-1/2 x 5-1/2 soft cover book with approximately 250 colored photos and a lot of details regarding the different mold numbers, marks, sizes and prices for these pieces. This will make it very handy for us to carry along with us when auctioning and flea marketing. They really focused on identifying Uhl Pottery pieces and gave us an example of rarity that we might too be lucky to come across in our searches. The approximate date for purchase is in August or December of 2001, however viewing material and pre-order forms will be available at the 2001 Uhl Collectors Society Convention in June. Like most collectors identification and value guides, this book should retail around \$40.00 or less.

I want to thank Anna Mary & Kara for giving me the opportunity to visit with them and sharing with me the progress they have made.

In addition it was marked "Uhl Pottery" on the bottom.

Whether this one was made for a special MVP player or that more of them exist is a topic for some research. We feel sure that the question will be answered someway or somehow.

So, never give up, there are still items out there for us to find. By the way, the basketball was purchased for \$953.00

While the two books contain similar material, the Pottery & Ceramics book is somewhat more extensive in its content regarding Uhl Pottery



HO! HO! HO!


What did Tom Trambaugh get from his wife for Christmas? Uhl Pottery of course. She found this mauve/rose glazed num-


