As always we have plenty of questions. They purchased their pieces from Terre Haute to Brazil to Zionville to any antique shop or flea market along the way for many years.

It was the beautiful way that she had her treasures displayed, not like many of us who put the blue with the blue, mauve with mauve or yellow with yellow. They were all arranged pitcher to pitcher, bowl to bowl. Just

a unique, eye catching way.

When I asked how the Club got started, she told me Sue Maynard had run an ad in the Tri-State Trader that read, "Is anyone out there interested in starting an UHL Pottery Club? If so, contact Sue Uhl." The date was June 1985.

Jim contacted Sue genuinely interested - interested enough to want to get involved and take some responsibility in getting a collectors club started.

During our little visit, Lucille shared her first newsletter with us and a few unique items that were sold by Jim and Lucille at the convention. She also showed us newspaper clippings from the Evansville paper that helped them identify the UHL treasures long before any books were published on our UHL Pottery.

Again, we cannot thank Lucille enough for her kindness to Frank and me.

We're not sure there's any connection, but that makes it interesting. Uhl pottery is very uncommon in Iowa, almost rare! But by letting friends know what we're collecting, we've found a number of pieces through them. Recently, we received a 5 gallon Uhl jug for babysitting.

My favorite pieces are serving dishes that we can use when entertaining, like mugs, bowls, pitchers. My husband's favorites are three miniature jugs with "Greetings from Uhl Pottery", "Merry Christmas 1937" and "Merry Christmas 1940".

Our first show is scheduled for Saturday, October 12 at the Dutchman (Best Western) Inn at Huntingburg. If you need to make plans for overnight as we will, the enclosed brochure will give you the phone number. 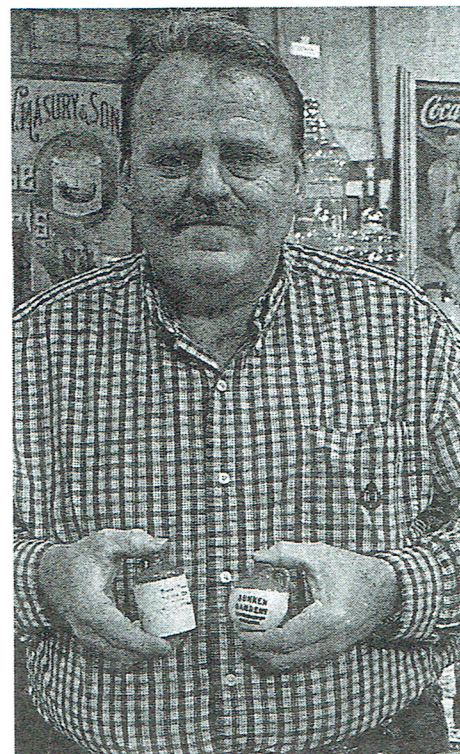
The Uhl Collectors Society was organized on June 10, 1985, by Sue Uhl of Orland, Indiana with the backing of her husband, John. John and Sue are not family members of the pottery makers; but began collecting because of the same last name. The idea of a society began because there is so little in print about the Uhl pottery that John and Sue wanted to learn from others who have collected for a longer period of time.

The society was organized with the following rules:

1. Membership only to collectors of Uhl pottery; not to those simply wanting "free schooling" for financial gain.
2. Membership to run by calendar year.
3. Permission to give your name, address and telephone number to all members so they may contact you when in your area.
4. An annual trade show and sale to be held.
5. Input from members for the newsletter pertaining to the Uhl hobby.
6. Printing and distributing of a bi-monthly newsletter.
(added since first annual meeting held on 10/12/85)
7. A 3 x 5 card file to be kept by the president of members wants and items for sale.
8. Dues set at \$10.00 per year per household whether you are one collector or a plurality payable in January or before.

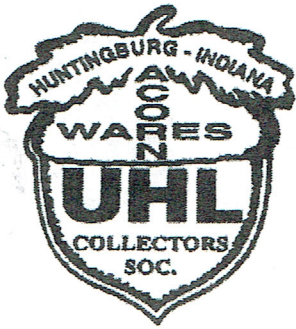
