

Thanks to Brian K. and Karla J. Neukam for an interesting article and the pictured pieces.

The Uhl brown 8 cup marked teapot, that was probably a mistake, that made it out of the factory, belonged to Karla's grandparents, Frank and Augusta Loepker. Frank was the Professor of the Catholic Schools in Jasper and Augusta was a long time merchant of downtown Jasper, the Georgia Lee Gift Shop. Both were born at the turn of the century. Frank died in 1968 and Augusta died in 2002. We are not sure how



they acquired the teapot. After Frank's death, Augusta traveled to Europe and Russia in the 70's and 80's and acquired many nice antiques in her travels. While the estate was being divided up the teapot was overlooked for the finer pieces of porcelain. We found it of interest with its



uncontrolled acid wash type of glazing. This piece is what sparked our interest in Uhl and keeps us collecting today.

The whatsit vase is 7 1/2 inches tall and is definitely hand turned. It has the green color to be a Jane Uhl piece. The top is flared with three crimpings that you see in the hand turned bowls. The color of clay looks right, but the two vertical

lines in the vase are intentional, being a rust color and a blue/black color to create character, may not be trademarks of Uhl. I recently acquired the vase.

The Uhl marked green canister with hand painted daisies under the glaze is 3" tall. It is definitely a rare piece of Uhl. Had to



be done by an artist who had brush skills. There are two marks

on the bottom of the piece. One being very light as it is a mirror image from another piece that was turned upside down and rubbed into the smaller piece before firing. This piece was recently acquired and I am tickled to have it.
