

The next list and set of pictures I was able to get at a Huntingburg In. auction on Sunday October 30th. It was the estate sale of Clara Prior. Mr. Prior worked at the pottery in the glaze room, and on his way home took along some very exquisite pieces of pottery. 130 Uhl items were sold during a very lengthy auction which commanded astonishing orices as you will see. Some pieces that were believed in the past not to be Uhl were in this sale. Which takes away any of the doubt that many members had over the years about them. One of these is a white ink well with the word. FISHER on the front with blue letters. How do we know for sure. Well how about part of the Uhl stamp in blue on the edge of the piece. Also a one and only ever Christmes jug. Yes a half gallon shoulder jug in brown and white. With TWO HANDLES and TWO UHL ACORNS and TWO MERRY CHRISTMAS 1941 stamps on the side. This

piece brought the highest bid for the day. It topped out at a mere \$1900.00 after the dust settled.









IN THE MAIL BAG

We found a brown bulcous pitcher in an antique shop in Mt. Dora. Florida. It was \$95 and we passed it up. A year later we were in the Orlando area and made a special trip to that same shop to get that pitcher. A (CLOSED) sign was on the door. We

could see the pitcher through the window. Very disappointed, we went to some near by shops inquiring about the store hours, but got no helpful info. As we were getting into our car to leave, a man came walking up the sidewalk and took his keys out to unlock the shop. After telling him our story he offered us the pitcher for \$50.

My husband's father. Gerald F Dittmer, grew up in Huntingburg Ind. His parents were Joseph and Norma Dittmer. They had Gerald's baby shoe cast at the Uhl factory. (He was born in 1925.) We also have a miniature jug (1") that he had as a boy.

Jerry and I have been good friends with an antique dealer here in Wilmington N.C. for about eight years. We've bought a number of things from her. Visiting her recently I noticed she had but out a lot of new small items. She said she had cleaned out some boxes that she'd had in her attic. She did not realize that the baseball jug was a piece of Uhl. I got it for \$20.

We were at a large antique show at the convention center in Raleigh N.C. (about 2 hours from our home). We overheard a hometown dealer, that we have visited many times, asking someone if he had ever heard of Uhl Pottery. We told him we wanted to drop by the next week to see the Uhl pieces. He had five miniatures (canteen, paper weight, prunella jug. shoulder jug. and a bellied pitcher). I bought them all for \$300. I understand one of the pieces is worth that.

The above four articles are from Sherry & Jerry Dittmer. I really do appreciate you sharing these storys with us Sherry. and hope to hear from you again.

Pickings have been slim since the convention, having found only 4 items. I was starting to get discouraged.

That is, until last week!

It's 10 pm. and I've just got home from one of those evening "junk" auctions. I'm still excited. I bought a marked #522 cookie jar and a blue 10 oz squat jar with cover and a paper label "Turkev Trot State Park". Additionally, in the last week we've bought a green, brown lined, #29 mini ewer with "2704 B" scratched into the foot (perhaps indicating a trial glaze?), a 9" marked rose salad bowl, and 2 mini wine jugs! This has been a nice way to end that dry spell, 411 6 pieces for \$78!!!!!

Does anyone know the worth of a blue bottom to the novelty biece as shown on page 69. McCurdy? I know where one is, but it seems expensive for an incomplete piece.

I want you to know that I am still smarting over your Uhl finds in Lebanon. I have spent several hours in both Lebanon and Waynesville antique shops without any real luck. The only pieces


I saw were the more common ones and at excrbitant prices. There was a 3 gal acorn jar for \$75 and a 5 gal acorn jug for \$125. plus a couple casserples for \$60-70. Incidentally, Waynesville has about about 40 antique shops, so you can't go through them in 20-30 minutes. Kitty and I used to go to both Lebanon and Waynesville regularly, but without much luck. Although I did find a softball in Waynesville several years ago at a good price (\$18). Anyway. I intend to continue to try there regularly to see if what you found was just by chance or if there really is Uhl to be found there on a regular basis.

To let everyone else in on the above letter. I had a busness meeting in Cincinnati Ohio earlier this year. Should have had no time to go shopping but the meeting ended an hour early. which was 4 pm. Knowing I was close to Lebanon I took off like a flash. And like always when your in a big hurry I took the wrong exit and had to back-track. Pulled into town at 4:35 and all shops close at exactly 5 pm. I went to malls and blew up and down isles as fast as my eyes could travel. Found a peach #168 vase in the first, paid for it and left without a bag. The second mall I found a 2 handled mini jug in peach and a style mini pitcher similar to the #28 but smaller in pink. Paid for these and left without wrapping or a bag. Went in to the third but as I was walking through the door the lights were being turned off. A couple of isles but found no Uhl. After this 25 minutes of a race against time I headed home with three pieces and spent a total of \$18 dollars.

Now you know why Bill is out to prove, chance or secret!!!

Bill did have some luck at a local antique mall show. He found a rose basket that has the round handturned stamp and an incised "F 9" on the bottom. It is 8 inches tall and 8 inches wide. Below is a photo of it.
