VACATION NETS ONE PIECE OF UHL EVERY 460 MILES

Unpacking the motorhome after our nine week, 8744 mile trip, we realized that our UHL purchases numbered 19 pieces. Two pieces we're not sure on, but sure enough to buy them.

An interesting sight in a mercantile display at Pioneer Village in Minden, Nebraska is an all white UHL shoulder jug in the 5 gallon size.

It was great to see old UHL friends at convention after a three year period; and to meet some new ones. Here's a list of what we purchased from you and from merchants along the journey:

- In Rose: 5-1/2" chili bowl, stamped
- #132 teapot, stamped and numbered
- 5-1/4" casserole with lid, stamped
- #123 vase, stamped and numbered

In Blue: round, handled candleholder with American Legion

- Auxiliary stamp on bottom
- elephant jug, unmarked
- #528 large casserole with lid, numbered
- #29 3" mini pitcher, unmarked "souvenir of / Dick Hudlestone's Store / Pine Ridge, Arkansas / 1937"

In Yellow: Jane Uhl candy dish, stamped

- #28 mini pitcher pitcher, numbered

In Green: 2-1/2" globe jug, dark: unmarked

In Black: elephant jug, unmarked
8" vase "Save It with Flowers!"

In Brown: small football, unmarked

In Peach: baby shoe 5" long

Also: 1-gallon shoulder jug, brown over white
3-gallon jar

Yesterday, at a local mall, I bought 3-1/4" brown over white,
one handled, bellied jug. On one side it says "Compliments of A F
Johnson / 278 Front St. /". The reverse says "The O L Gregory /
Vinegar Co / Elko County / Pure Apple Juice / Vinegar / Paducah,
Ky /".

We recently made two pottery purchases. One was made while we were looking around in Illinois. It is a 5 gallon unmarked water cooler. This cooler came with 2 narrow and 1 wide blue band on the lid and 4 narrow and 2 wide blue bands around the jar. It also has a wooden spigot and the opening for the spigot is heavily (looks like half a donut) reinforced. We did not purchase this piece as a Uhl product.


We then fell into a seven gallon flour jar, it came from Pensacola, Florida. When we put these two jars side by side - well. The blue bands around the jars and the lids look identical in color and size.

The one thing that kept us from believing the cooler is Uhl is the reinforced bunghole is not the usual way Uhl made their coolers. Usually the coolers have a rather small drilled hole with little or no reinforcement. We later saw an Uhl 8 gallon, two handled sorghum jug with wooden spigot and the bunghole had the same heavy reinforcement as our cooler. Our other Uhl coolers have metal spigots. It appears that Uhl reinforced the bunghole when a wooden spigot was used and they did not use much reinforcement for metal spigots.

We now want to believe our new cooler is an Uhl product. What is your opinion?


