Is it just me, or am I seeing a lot of common, uninteresting pieces, many not even Uhl, for very uncommon prices.

I'd like to point out an incorrect bit of information in the Duke book. Though I might have had a hand in starting the story that Morton made the look-alike dogs. I have since found this to be incorrect. These dogs, "pointer" and "setter", were made by Camark. This is confirmed by catalogues as well as labeled pieces. Regardless, the book has a much better Uhl listing than any other available. By the way, I am a book vendor and normally have copies of this on hand.

I have a question for other members. Does the presence of paper or foil labels affect the price you are willing to give for pieces, especially the miniatures? It does with me!

I have a very similar jug, sans advertising, to the one in the last newsletter. After much soul searching I decided mine wasn't Uhl. I felt that although the shape was right, the clay made it seem doubtful, and more likely from a central Illinois potter.

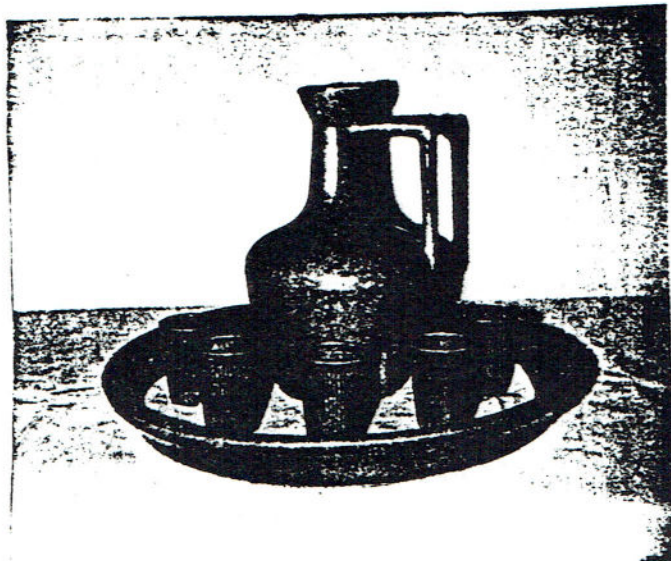
