RE: COMMEMORATIVE DISTRIBUTION

IN RESPONSE TO SOME OF THE LETTERS REGARDING THE CHANGE IN
COMMEMORATIVE DISTRIBUTION:

1. OUR MEMBERSHIP IS ALMOST UP TO 800 - TO SIMPLIFY AND SPEED UP
DISTRIBUTION, IT WAS DECIDED TO CHANGE THE PROCESS.
2. OUR BREAKAGE RATIO IS MINIMAL. THE COMMEMORATIVES ARE INSURED IN
CASE OF A BREAKAGE DOES OCCUR.
3. SINCE THE COMMEMORATIVES ARE TAKEN TO THE UPS STATION, IT ONLY
MAKES SENSE TO MAKE ONE TRIP OPPOSED TO TWO TRIPS. (IN SOME CASES NOT
ALL OF THE COMMEMORATIVES ARE PICKED UP AT THE CONVENTION. THIS IS
THE REASON WE WAIT UNTIL AFTER THE CONVENTION IS OVER TO SHIP ALL OF
THE COMMEMORATIVES AT ONE TIME.)
4. SHIPPING COSTS CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING: BOXES, PACKING, LABELS
AND SHIPPING CHARGES (KEEP IN MIND WE SHIP TO ALL PARTS OF THE U.S.)
5. DID NOT WANT TO LIMIT THE COMMEMORATIVE TO BE PICKED UP AT THE
CONVENTION AS THE ONLY MEANS OF RECEIVING A COMMEMORATIVE. SOME
CLUBS DO NOT OFFER SHIPPING, ONLY THAT YOU HAVE TO BE PRESENT AT THE
CONVENTION TO PICK UP YOUR COMMEMORATIVE.

PLEASE KEEP IN MIND THAT OUR POSITIONS ARE ON A VOLUNTEER BASIS AND
WE TRY TO MAKE DECISIONS THAT WE FEEL WILL BENEFIT THE CLUB AND HELP
MAKE THE CONVENTION RUN SMOOTHLY. THERE COMES A TIME WHEN YOU
NEED TO TRY NEW AND DIFFERENT METHODS TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF
THE CONVENTION AND THE CLUB.

We as a club have lost a good friend and officer. Carson Smith passed away in January, and to his wife Joann you have our deepest sympathy.

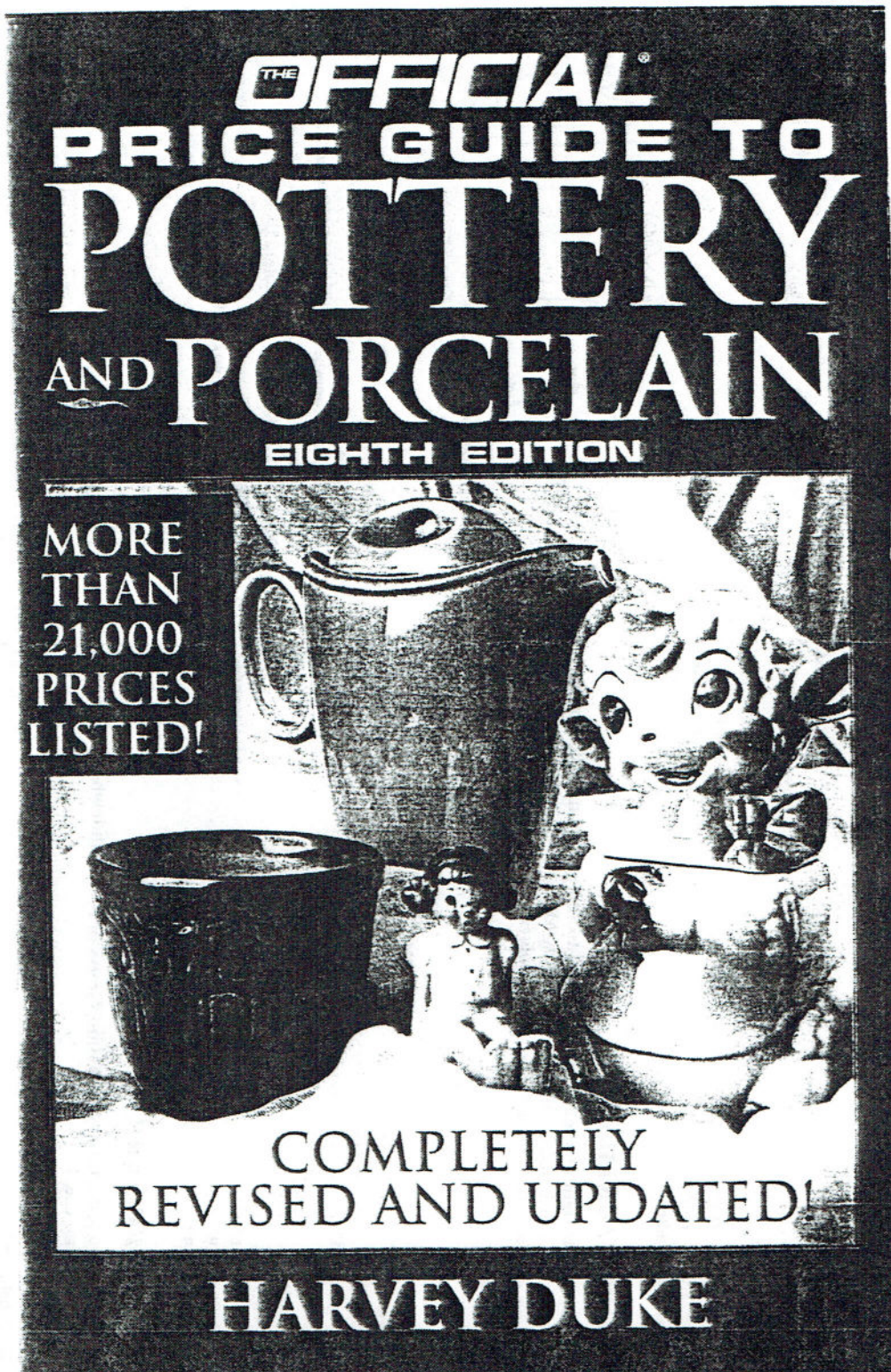

The dog has its right rear leg raised. This is the only version that Uhl made. A squatting dog, attributed to Uhl, was made by Morton.

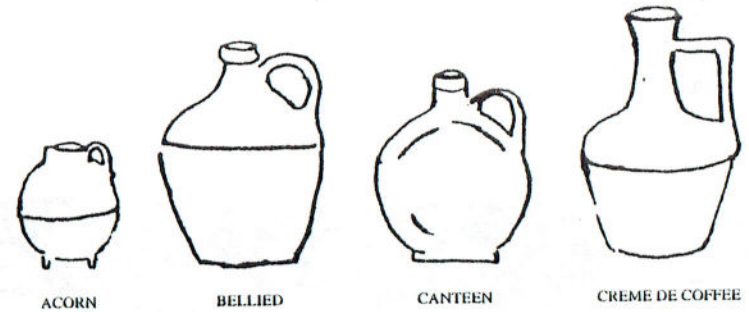

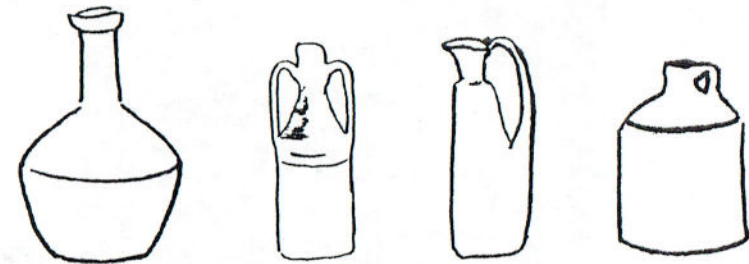
