1997 Uhl Convention Revue

The 12th annual Uhl Collectors Society Convention was held at the Jasper Holiday Inn Friday June 20th and Saturday, June 21, 1997.

A large near capacity crowd enjoyed the room to room sales and displays presented by Uhl members starting Friday morning.

The commemorative for 1997 was the jug coin bank. Those who purchased this unusual piece should enjoy it for years to come.

All members looked forward to the Friday evening buffet dinner, which was attended by a record number of 720 collectors and guests.

President Don Schwartz introduced Lou and Sharon Dysinger of Shelbyville, Indiana, a direct descendant of the original Uhl family. Lou shared some of his Uhl collecting experiences with the membership.

The annual evening Uhl auction was held after dinner. There were 124 pieces up for sale to the highest bidder.

Auctioneers for the event were Glen Hackman and Chip Kugler. (Auction prices are also in this issue.)

After the auction many members were again visiting the room to room sales and exchanging information until the "wee" hours.

Saturday morning members were offered a continental breakfast while awaiting the set up of the membership sale held in the banquet room.

Several tables of Uhl products were available at opening time and buying appeared to be quite brisk at times with a good attendance.

This year the membership sale required visible pricing of items and collectors gave positive feedback regarding it.

The business meeting was held at 10 am Saturday with a large attendance.

Nominations for vice president and one board member position were made.

The new vice president is Lloyd and Marge Martin of Jasper, Indiana, and new board



member will be Alvin Schwartz of Worthington, Indiana.

Retiring members Don Schwartz and Dave and Tammy Lottes were presented with special commemoratives. Also the vice president Joseph Erbacher was given a special commemorative. The membership gave them a well deserved round of applause for their efforts.

Among the topics discussed at the meeting were multiple memberships in the same household, Uhl auction guidelines and creating a club historian position.

IN SEARCH OF UHL ANIMALS PART TWO

Welcome back into the Uhl animal kingdom. Just to refresh your memory the last newsletter discussed Uhl Pottery frogs, rabbits, dogs, donkeys, cats and pigs. This article will give information about the turtle, lamb, elephant, seal, swan and more.

Please note that any sizes given are approximate because shrinkage can vary.

Uhl pottery turtles are known to exist in at least two different designs, stylized and flat.

The "stylized" turtle had a more three dimensional look. It came in four sizes and most had an open mouth except the two smaller sizes which are also found with a closed mouth. The eyes were hand painted over glaze, and these Uhl turtles have a hollow opening on their underside. Stylized turtles came in realistic natural color of green with dark brown or black tones. They were favorites of customers to use outdoors, especially in the larger sizes.

"Flat" style turtles were usually solid with the bottom unglazed. Some of these designs were made as pencil holders with holes similar to a flower frog on the shell. Some solid turtles were even used as paperweights. Flat style turtles came in several sizes with the largest being 5 ½ inches long by 4 inches wide.

They were usually produced in brown or dark colors.

Uhl Pottery also made a standing lamb planter which had a bow around its neck. The legs were separated and the head faces forward. Some of the colors are white, black and pink. This is a difficult animal to distinguish since several other pottery companies also made similar lamb planters.

The elephant was also a popular Uhl animal that was made as a planter, ashtray or mini jug. All of the elephants were produced in several different colors

Elephant planters were made in two designs, dumbo and walking.

The "Dumbo" style elephant had large

ears like the Disney character and the front legs were connected as well as the back legs. Trunks on these elephants curve back to the forehead and touch. There should be an opening between the trunk and forehead of this elephant large enough to stick a lead pencil through.

The "walking" elephant planter came in two sizes. When compared to the dumbo planter, the ears and legs had more detail. The trunk also curves back and touches the forehead.

Uhl also used an elephant as part of its #173 ashtray design. This is a round ashtray base with a small standing elephant figure. Trunks on the elephants are stretched out from the head curving upwards at the end.

Mini jugs with the elephant in a sitting position and had an open space between the trunk and the forehead similar to the dumbo style elephant. (Refer to last issue for picture.)

Uhl even produced a seal figural. The hollow base that was utilized for electrical lamps had a notch at the bottom for the cord. There was also a closed base design. The front feet were not joined together and had lines on each foot to make toes at the end. All have a hollow hole at the nose. Pink, white and black colors have been found. The seal will have its head upwards as if were balancing a ball on its nose. It is 8 inches long by 7 3/4 inches tall.

The Uhl swan figure has its head turned down with the bill attached to the breast area. Overall not much detail was used on the swan planter, except for the horizontal lines on each side representing wings. Yellow and white are the colors most found with unglazed bottoms. Swan planters measure about 7 ½ inches long and 4 ½ inches tall.

Uhl animals would not be complete without a horse. And so the horse head mini jug was created. It is 2 ½ inches long by 3 inches tall and came in several colors.

When Uhl employees were on break time or at dinner other creative animal pieces were molded by hand using the Huntingburg Clay. These included frog banks, small pig banks, solid body primitive looking frogs and even lion figures in the resting position.

We hope that your search for Uhl animals will be rewarded.




