The Scoop on Uhl Garden Pottery, Part 2

Welcome to springtime! Hopefully you will have an opportunity to acquire some Uhl garden pieces so your flowers will have a nice home.

This is the last half of the garden pottery article and only issue left for the Uhl membership year.

Uhl pottery pieces covered in this article will include the Roman Urn, Ribbed Flowerpots, Roman Sundial and Compass, Roman Porch Pot, Pedestals, Grecian Fern Pot, Doric Pots, Roman Fern Pot, and the Wren House.

Again a reminder that color information and sizes were taken from Uhl catalog descriptions. As time passed Uhl did add more colors to their products so don't be surprised to find these items in more colors than what is discussed.

Roman Urns were available in three combinations. The C-23 Roman Urn planter resembles a large bowl sitting on a smaller bowl turned upside down. The lip of this planter turns back to the inside of the bowl. Alternating fern and flower patterns go around the main body while the Roman Urn base has fluted panels around it. Dimensions for the Roman Urn are 12" tall by 18" wide. The C-24 and C-25 Roman Urn included a pedestal with the basic urn planter. Overall height for the C-24 model was 25". The taller model C-25 has a height of 32". Popular colors for the Roman Urn production were terra cotta and old ivory.

Ribbed Flowerpots were available with attached saucers also. Sizes started with the small hard to find 2" diameter. From there production sizes of 3", 4", 5", 6", 7" and 8" were made. The

rib sided pots have a wider rib at the lip. Uhl pottery produced these pots in assorted glaze colors.

The Roman Sundial and Compass were produced by Uhl to compliment the pedestal production. Either piece was about 12" in diameter. The compass has the design of an eight-piece pie with its directional lines raised. Sundials have the typical vertical wedge-shaped centerpiece as used by many various companies. The picture of father time with his message makes sundial a nice conversation piece. Pedestals for the Sundial or Compass pieces were sold in four different heights. The C-28 model is 27 1/2" tall including sundial, C-29 models 27 1/2" tall, C-30 model 38" tall with compass and C-32 model 38" tall with compass. Colors available included terra cotta, old ivory or brushed green for Sundial or Compass pieces.

Roman Porch Pots were produced by Uhl pottery to be used as a footed planter or in combination with a special pedestal. These porch pots were available in two sizes C-14 and C-16. Dimensions of the C-14 is 14" in diameter and 11" tall while the C-16 model measures 16 ½" in diameter and 13 ¼" tall. They resemble a Roman Urn with more capacity.

Pedestals have a wide flared foot with a floral pattern at the base and fluted sides on the main body. The upper part of the pedestal has a ring of matching floral patterns similar to the pot. The C-15 pedestal went with the C-14 pot and is 16" tall. Also the C-17 pedestal went with the C-16 pot and was taller at 19" in height. Colors available included old ivory, green or terra cotta.

Grecian Fern Pots have a distinct Grecian Key design around the shoulder of the pot. It appears to have four feet instead of a round plate style bottom. This fern pot is 12 ½" in diameter and was available in the terra cotta, or ivory colors.

Doric Pots have a more raised panel design around the sides and was decorated with a floral and leaf pattern. Special-designed matching saucers were made to be used with this 12" tall tapered pot. Colors available for the Doric Pot and Saucer include terra cotta, old ivory and green.

Model C-31 **Roman Fern Pots** were a large 18" in diameter and 12 ½" tall. Its cylindershape had ample room for a vine-design surrounded by rope rings around the entire side of the pot. The base has a slight inward taper with a vertical ribbed pattern. Colors available included

terra cotta and old ivory.

The last item of Uhl garden pottery for this article is one of the toughest production pieces to find. If you are fortunate enough to own a model 525 wren house consider yourself lucky! Uhl Wren Houses were designed to be three pieces bolted together. The house consisted of a cone shaped ribbed roof, the cylinder shape main body with a perch and hole, and a flat plate shaped bottom. These houses were 9" tall and available in terra cotta, dull green, and old ivory colors.

Good luck with your search for Uhl outdoor pottery. Hopefully it will be easier to spot with this information.

Just a reminder this is not all the Uhl production pieces made so keep your eyes open!

This cost the club an extra \$1870.00 for the unused dinners since the cost for each meal was \$11.50.






