1999 UHL CONVENTION REVUE

The Uhl conventions are always an adventure and the June 1999 convention was no exception. Several members had their rooms open for Uhl collectors to seek out and purchase their favorite items.

Friday afternoon the auction registration began and by the closing time 109 items were up for sale. (See auction prices inside this edition)

Friday evening started with auction preview and a wonderful meal. The hotel served 496 meals at this year's convention. Auctioneers for the evening were Glen Hackmann, Roy English and Chip Kugler.

Auction predictions that the price of pork (Uhl pigs) will be less than chicken this year was given by several "seasoned" Uhl collectors. Their prediction came true when a very desirable blue Rooster figural bottle came up for bid and closed at \$1600!

The top dollar item of the evening was a large black stylized cat signed and dated which fetched a final bid price of \$2475. (See January 1999 issue for a picture.)

Several pig banks were available this year including a Hitler Botay pig

bank at \$450, teal Botay pig bank with hairline for \$120, white Botay pig bank at \$100, and an unusual hand painted Botay pig bank with child playthings on it sold for \$300.

A good selection of Christmas jugs were available with the high dollar jug being a 1943 Christmas jug with the paper label intact which sold for \$1200.

Uhl animal collectors watched a black Scotty dog close at a \$500 bid and a white elephant, which brought \$160.

Hand turned pieces ranged from \$75 for a marked pink vase to \$775 for a green hand turned vase.

Saturday morning brought the Uhl members "Uhl Only Sale" in the banquet room. Over 20 tables of Uhl pottery were offered for sale.

After the sale ended members prepared for the business meeting and lottery of excess commemoratives. New board members elected were Leah Kleeman of Huntingburg for vice president and Tom and Stephanie Trambaugh of Loogootee filled the board member position.

Commemorative lottery went very quick this year thanks to pre registration at the board meeting. The Uhl Collectors Society issued 578 commemoratives for the 1999 membership. Charles Darnold was the lucky winner of the Happy Uhling commemorative this year.

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

The 1999 Uhl Collectors Society Convention is now a part of history. It is with considerable enthusiasm and some anxiety that I will be serving you, as best I can, during the next two years. As we begin another year of work we are pleased to welcome Leah Kleeman as new vice-president, along with Tom and Stephanie Trambaugh as new board members. You have assured positive and strong leadership for the future and we are well on our way with the task of planning for the 15th annual meeting, which will be on June 23 and 24, 2000. We were extremely pleased with the services of the Jasper Holiday Inn this year and will return next year.

We have requests for input into the commemorative selection. The only feasible way we could involve members is through written suggestions. Therefore, we are requesting that you put your suggestion on a post card and send to me. Remember that many factors are involved in final selection including price, quality, if it is something that most members might not have, and if the piece can be made efficiently. I look forward to receiving your suggestions. The small flower pot was an excellent example of a piece that many members might not have in their collection. A 1999 commemorative was priced at \$80 in a room. It reportedly sold for \$70.

Also, it is our intention to have a display at the annual meeting. We visualize this as a showing of rare and different pieces that most of us usually do not see. I will make efforts through local manufacturers to secure locked cases for this project. Please look at your collection and send me a description of items you would consider loaning for this project. If the piece is marked, we would ask you to take a photo of the mark to be displayed with the piece.

Finally, I wish to express my appreciation to "Effie" for his leadership over the past 4 years. Only those who have worked closely with him really realize the time and energy he put into leading the UCS. In addition, a great big "thank you" to Herman and JoAnn Stock for 3 years of leadership on the board. Let us give a thunderous applause (A GREAT BIG UHL HAND) and a pat on the back to all three of them.

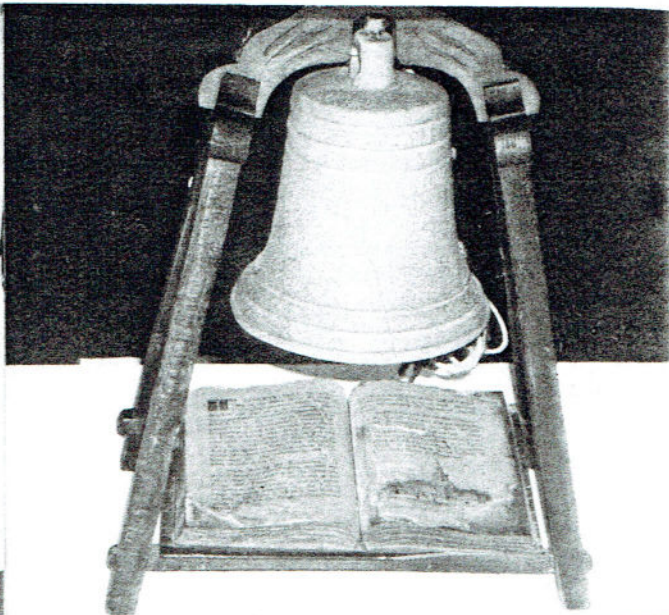

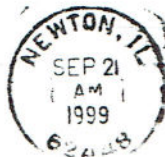
