We will continue to auction off the special glazed commemoratives, but will be hanging on to the Happy Uhling until Saturday morning. You must be present to win.

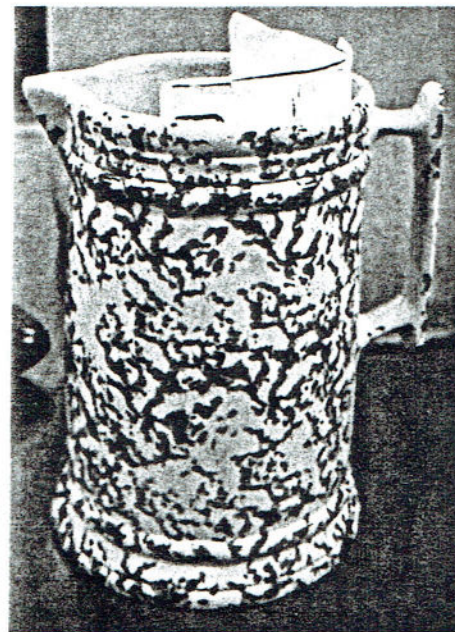
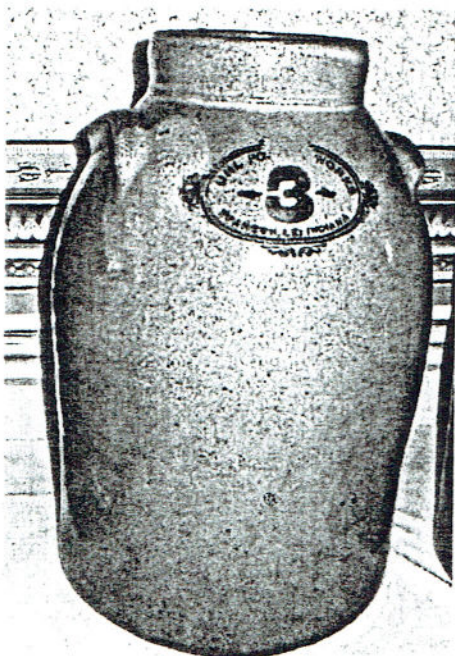
We hope this will entice you to get up out of your hotel room to attend this meeting. Some of the best ideas, suggestions and conversations come out of this meeting.

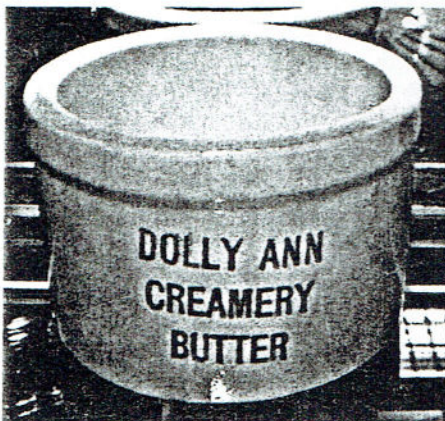
Dear Uhl Collector's Society Members
