Did You Know?

Lloyd Martin's Grandmother's "Throw Aways"

Lloyd Martin was born in 1940 in Santa Claus, Indiana. He grew up in Santa Claus working and visiting, occasionally, at his Grandmother's General Store.

He remembers going with her to the Uhl Pottery Company in Huntingburg to buy items to sell in the General Store.

Lloyd went on to graduate from Dale High School in 1958 and then enrolled at Murray State University in Kentucky. Later he transferred to Kentucky Wesleyan and received an Education degree in 1963.

Lloyd started his first teaching job at Utica, in Davies County Kentucky, in 1963. He taught Social Studies. 1963 was a very good year because he married his Sweetheart, Wonderful Marge.

There was also a tragedy in Lloyd's life in 1963: his beloved Grandmother passed away in Santa Claus, Indiana.

Lloyd and his relatives got together in 1966 and started going through his Grandmother's personal belongings. It was from a pile of "throwaways" left in a washtub that Lloyd would get his start collecting Uhl Pottery.

Lloyd literally put these items in a box and carted them with his family to Jasper in 1969 to teach for the Jasper school system.

Settling in at 1582 Gregory Lane, Lloyd spent 29 years in the Jasper Community School Corporation retiring in 1998.

In the summer of 1982 Lloyd went to an auction in Jasper where he met a well-known collector of Uhl pottery: Linda Summers. It was at the auction that Lloyd told Linda that he had this 1933 Christmas Jug at home from his Grandmother's pile of "throw-aways".

Linda showed an interest and asked Lloyd how much it would take to pry this Uhl treasure form his clutches. Her retort was, "How about one hundred dollars?"

Wow!!! Lloyd started researching Uhl pottery from 1982 to the present and hundreds of Uhl pieces and thousands of dollars poorer they now have Lloyd and Marge's beauI have asked that all members, new and not so new, write a short story on how they got started collection our Uhl Pottery Treasures. 

Dear Uhl Collectors Society,



Minutes of the 19th Annual Uhl Convention

June 26, 2004

The 19th annual Uhl Convention was called to order at 9:30 a.m. in the Black Walnut Room of the Holiday Inn, Jasper, IN by President Jerry Schurz.

President Jerry welcomed all and shared a joke with the crowded room.

Minutes of the 2003 annual meeting were read by Secretary Barbara Barnes. A motion to approve was read was made by Jackie Wilson, seconded by Nelda Mendel and voted in the affirmative. The Treasurers report was also read by Barbara Barnes with a copy of that report attached starting with a balance of \$23,306.60 in 2004. A motion to approve was made by Al Schwartz, seconded by Carol Hill and also voted as approved.

The President presented a slate of officers to fill the position of Secretary/Treasurer being Amy & Sam Busler, and Board Member being Leslie Bain. No other nominations were made form the floor. These positions will be for a three year term.

President Jerry presented outgoing Secretary/Treasurer Barbara Barnes and outgoing Board Members Dan and Lee Hadley with special 2004 Commemoratives and thanked them for an excellent job.

New Business:

The 20th Anniversary was briefly discussed with many exciting plans being made.

James Uhl stated that the room rate was \$9.00 more than internet rate. Jerry Tabband shared that he felt the lowest rate should be secured by contract with the Holiday Inn. Jackie Wilson stated that using a priority card was much cheaper also. President Jerry assured everyone that he would personally check into the rates and get an answer out to the membership.

Clarence Brown commended the excellent idea of the new name tags. The board plans to improve them by putting the membership number on the back next year.

Don Schwartz questioned about insurance coverage after a near disaster of the table containing Uhl in the auction almost collapsing. Jerry assured all that he would also check on the coverage.

The drawing for the "Happy Uhling" commemorative was won by Filinda Farris and then 35 commemoratives were purchased by the membership in a drawing. All numbers were re-interred and a drawing for donated items took place donated by an anonymous person. All had choice items.

Facts given by President Jerry:

2003 members 565 dinners 475 Com 525 Tables 26

2004 members 580 dinners 467 Com 540 Tables 19

Other suggestions and discussion was as follows:

Horse head for consideration in the future for the commemorative.

A number list of Uhl to be compiled by Pam Robbins.

The photo give-away individuals to be identified in the newsletter.

Question about membership limitations in a household. President Jerry shared that the board is looking into the bylaws and plans to adopt a more clear definition of membership within a year.

Commemorative hand outs versus mailing will be decided later but the method this year seemed to work with pick up at the convention and an extra fee to have them mailed.

President Jerry shared that he would like to see all members increase the membership by signing at least one new member this year. A suggestion was made to have an award for the person who signs the most new members in 2004-2005.

Were the pins profitable? We will give a report at a later date.

Questioned about the Special room containing displays and Almost or look alikes being open on Saturday. Many displayed items are very valuable and we do not have a sheriff on duty after the auction starts on Friday evening. The board will look into a solution.

Charter members and new members were recognized.

A motion to dismiss was made by Lois Uhl and seconded by Maurice Berendes.









