Did You Know? Uhl Collecting from Columbus, Indiana

I was in the eighth grade in 1968 when the UHL phenomena began in our family. My father, Lenord Sheldon, was a barber at Bob's barbershop. Bob often went to lunch at Pearl's restaurant on the corner, and on this particular day when he returned, he told my father that a man who had been in Pearl's for lunch talked about a garage that was being torn down that had a large unusual crock in it.

Dad called my mother and inquired about her interest in a large unusual crock. I guess she had no strong objections because he went and got it.

This part of the story began with dad offering a woman who came out to greet him \$15 for the crock. About the time she accepted dad's offer a man appeared on the scene and informed dad and the woman that the crock went with the house and garage he just purchased. The man accepted the same \$15, and dad brought the crock home in his John Deere Green 1954 Chevrolet pickup truck.

When dad got home, mother said, "That's big". Oh yea...this was a 50 gal. UHL crock complete with the

acorn on the side. It tips the scale around 180 lbs., and is physically larger than a 55 gallon drum.

Now we start looking for "acorn pottery". We would go to Sunday auctions, flea markets and look for "acorn pottery". In these times, we found of crocks and jugs in sizes from one to ten gallons, excepting the 7 gallon size which was harder to find. There were also chicken feeders and water containers, mugs and pitchers. The only fixed rule of purchase was it had to have the acorn on the side, or the acorn stamp on the bottom. The significance of the UHL name also present on the "acorn pottery" was not yet evident.

I started collecting in 1974 shortly after Stephen and I married and had our own home. Then it was still easy to find pieces for a few dollars.

In 1978 Stephen and I moved to the country, a larger home and we had a new attraction. There was an auction barn about two miles from us, which had an auction almost every Friday evening. Dad and I would come home with a piece or two. I quickly became most interested in mauve pieces.

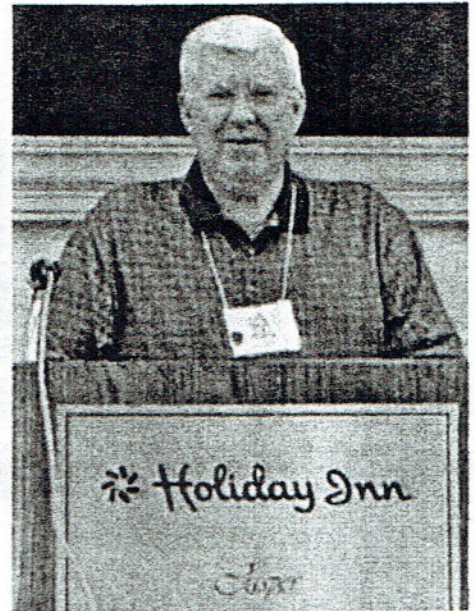

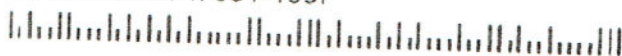
