

MYSTERIOUS MARKS

The historical mystery of stoneware pottery has always kept my full attention in the collecting market. It is relatively easy to figure out the manufacturing process, from the mining of the clay to the firing of the kiln. This was similar for all potters of the 19th and 20th centuries while some were more automated on a larger scale than others. Over the years we have acquired a few pieces of "Southern Indiana" stoneware and each one of the different potteries that surrounded us seems to always have some sort of mystery that keeps me looking for answers, and more pottery of course. Uhl pottery is always finding its way to the top of my question list. While these questions may have been answered in the past and maybe someone knows the answers to these, both I hope and if you do please get a hold of us and let me know. My number one question with Uhl Pottery is the "Acorn" logo, where does it originate from why was it adopted after moving to Huntingburg from Evansville does it represent strength? My next question is the "UCO FEEDER" who/what is UCO, is it an acronym, a farmers name, maybe even a brand of feed...? Last on my quick list is the "McHenry Churn" and you guessed it, just who is McHenry, potter... farmer... dairy... general store? And why is his churn "improved" was the original wood, stoneware with a bad design, glass, I have no idea but if you do please let me know! While my list of questions maybe unlimited and the answers are probably known I always enjoy the challenge of trying to figure out these types of questions. If you do have any or all of the answers give us a shout I would enjoy the opportunity to share it with our members.

2016 COMMEMORATIVE

What a unique commemorative that we had this year! The board of directors put their heads together for the 2016 commemorative and after a lot of discussion decided on the Jane Uhl Platter. The next big challenge was to find someone who owns one of these

hard to find beauties and allow us to borrow it and ship it to our mold maker for a few months. With the rarity and value of these platters being so high we decided to go to our potter and have a smaller one replicated and send it off to have the mold casted from. It turned out to be a great decision because the piece was broken in transit to the mold maker,

luckily they were able to glue it to make the mold.



This year was a new chapter in commemoratives for us, as our past potter, Scott Marshall, retired from the commemorative business leaving us searching for a new potter. From his suggestion we were blessed to find Cheyenne Knox from Gentryville and what a great job she did! Our first task for Cheyenne was to replicate the Jane Uhl Piece for the mold making process, she made three total, all smaller than the original, one of which was sadly broken, but the other two were sold in our auction at the convention as 2016 "special" commemoratives. They are larger than the others we all received and were hand marked by Cheyenne so they could never be passed as an original. She truly is a talented artist and potter and we are so glad she accepted the challenge to make our commemoratives for the club. We would also like to welcome her as a new member to the society this year as well.

Auction Highlights From Your 2016 Convention:

What an exciting auction we had at our 31'st annual Uhl Pottery Convention. We had 103 lots sell for a grand total of \$10,210 with only 13 "buy backs". We kindly had 8 lots donated to the scholarship fund that generated \$295 to a future Uhl Collectors education. Not a big shock to collectors but once again this year Jane Uhl art pottery and garden ware remained the top selling items. The second largest Turtle (unmarked) netted the highest bid of the evening at a whopping \$850.
